



Crafternoon Treats large flower

Free pattern: UK terms

Materials

- Four main toning colours in a DK (light worsted weight) yarn plus white and yellow
- 4mm (UK size) crochet hook (or go slightly smaller and use a 3.75mm or a 3.5mm)
- Scissors
- Darning needle

Deramores Studio DK yarn colours

I used one ball of each of mist, blue velvet, sky and topaz and small amounts of frost and citrine.



UK terms are used throughout

Round 1

- Using Citrine (yellow), make 4 chains.
- Join with a slip stitch to form a ring.
- Make two chains.
- Make 11 trebles into the ring.
- Close with a neat join. [Cut yarn, pull through last stitch. Sew through both loops of first treble from front to back. Sew through last treble between front and back loops. Pull to close and weave in ends.

Round 2

- Using Frost (white), make a standing treble into one of the spaces between the treble stitches in round 1.



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- Make an ordinary treble into the same space.
- Make two trebles into each remaining space.
- Join with the neat joining method as in round 1.
- You will have 12 white petals.

Round 3

Using one of your main colours, make a popcorn stitch consisting of one standing treble and 3 trebles into one of the spaces between the 12 petals in round 2. Make 2 chains then make another popcorn stitch separated by 2 chains in each space of round 2. Close with a slip stitch. You will have 12 popcorn petals.

A popcorn stitch:

- Remove your hook from the loop of the fourth treble
- Insert the hook through both loops at the top of the first treble then through the loop of the fourth treble once more
- Yarn over and pull through all loops on your hook.

Round 4

- Take another of your main colours, and work into the chain spaces between the popcorn petals of round 3.
- Join the new colour by pulling a loop into one of the spaces. Make a chain to join. This counts as a double crochet (dc). Into the same space make a half treble (htr), a treble (tr), a half double treble (hdtr), a treble (tr), a half treble (htr) and a dc.
- Into each of the other spaces make one dc, one htr, one tr, one hdtr, one tr, one htr and one dc. Join with a slip stitch.

You will have 12 petals.

Weave in your ends and then gently steam block to give an even shape to all the outer petals.



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
